<u>Demonstrations of Hypnotic Inductions with</u> practice and discussion

The quantum theory of the future creating the present was explained by Dr Pulos and the subject of our life being a printout of our beliefs was discussed. He also gave a handout with a hypnotic script and abstracts of 2 articles 'The Creative Psychosocial Genomic Healing Experience' Ernest Rossi et al and 'A New Bioinformatics Paradigm for the Theory, Research and Practice of Therapeutic Hypnosis'. Ernest Rossi et al.

Dr Pulos, as always, gave us a fascinating demonstration of hypnotic inductions with ideomotor signaling. The focus was on goals and the volunteer was asked to think of her goal and choose 3 images of what she will see when the goal is achieved that she is not seeing now. The induction was the 'magic hands' then after deepening she was asked to see each image and breathe life into it for 30 seconds (this is the optimal time for goal visualization). Her subconscious was asked if it understood and accepted those images and was there anything else it would suggest adding in order that the goal be achieved. It was then suggested that she have a healing dream that would reinforce her optimal future.

The group practiced and there was a sharing of results and insights.
